- Both groups advocate for increased access to healthcare through single-payer health insurance (a publicly financed system that guarantees universal coverage, eliminates private insurance barriers, and reduces costs through centralized funding and negotiation)
- Empowers students to engage in advocacy in a variety of ways, including campus-based organizing, policy writing, direct action, educational efforts, and more.
